

## 2023-2024 Student Health Insurance Plan for Thomas Jefferson University - Undergraduates

## Who is eligible to enroll?

All matriculated students who a) have any on-campus experience and/or b) have a clinical/internship are required to have and annually verify health insurance coverage (see exemptions below). Students required to have insurance are charged for the Student Health Insurance Plan (SHIP) at registration and must confirm enrollment or submit a waiver to opt out by the deadline. Students who do not enroll or waive by the deadline will be enrolled in the SHIP retroactively to the policy effective date and responsible for the SHIP premium.

Exemptions: If the academic program is fully online and has no clinical/internship, if the academic program is in Continuing and Professional Studies (CPS), or if enrolled in a certificate program without a clinical/internship component then verification is not required and students are not eligible to purchase insurance through the university sponsored plan.

Eligible Dependents, including Domestic Partners of enrolled students may participate in the plan on a voluntary basis.
Eligible students who do enroll may also insure their Dependents. Eligible Dependents are the student's legal spouse or Domestic Partner and dependent children under 26 years of age. See the Definitions section of this Certificate for the specific requirements needed to meet Domestic Partner eligibility.

The student (Named Insured, as defined in this Certificate) must actively attend classes for at least the first 31 days after the date for which coverage is purchased. Home study, correspondence, and online courses do not fulfill the eligibility requirements that the student actively attend classes. The Company maintains its right to investigate eligibility or student status and attendance records to verify that the Policy eligibility requirements have been met. If and whenever the Company discovers that the Policy eligibility requirements have not been met, its only obligation is refund of premium.

The eligibility date for Dependents of the Named Insured shall be determined in accordance with the following:

1. If a Named Insured has Dependents on the date he or she is eligible for insurance.
2. If a Named Insured has Dependents and is issued a court or administrative order to provide insurance for those Dependent(s), the Dependents are eligible for insurance without enrollment restrictions:
a. On the date the Named Insured is ordered to provide insurance for said Dependent; and
b. We receive a copy of the order within 30 days of the date the court order or administrative order is issued.
3. If a Named Insured acquires a Dependent after the Effective Date, such Dependent becomes eligible:
a. On the date the Named Insured acquires a legal spouse or a Domestic Partner who meets the specific requirements set forth in the Definitions section of the Certificate.
b. On the date the Named Insured acquires a dependent child who is within the limits of a dependent child set forth in the Definitions section of the Certificate.

Dependent eligibility expires concurrently with that of the Named Insured.

## Where can I get more information about the benefits available?

Please read the certificate of coverage to determine whether this plan is right before you enroll. The certificate of coverage provides details of the coverage including benefits, exclusions, and reductions or limitations and the terms under which the coverage may be continued in force. Copies of the certificate of coverage are available from the University and may be viewed at www.uhcsr.com. This plan is underwritten by UnitedHealthcare Insurance Company and is based on policy number 2023-294-92. The Policy is a Non-Renewable One-Year Term Policy.

## Exclusions and Limitations

No benefits will be paid for: a) loss or expense caused by, contributed to, or resulting from; or b) treatment, services or supplies for, at, or related to any of the following:

1. Developmental delay or disorder or mental retardation. Learning disabilities.
2. Cosmetic procedures, except reconstructive procedures to correct an Injury or treat a Sickness, or to restore normal bodily function, for which benefits are otherwise payable under the Policy. The primary result of the procedure is not a changed or improved physical appearance.
3. Custodial Care.

- Care provided in: rest homes, health resorts, homes for the aged, halfway houses, college infirmaries or places mainly for domiciliary or Custodial Care.
- Extended care in treatment or substance abuse facilities for domiciliary or Custodial Care.

4. Dental treatment, except:

- For accidental Injury to Natural Teeth.
- As specifically provided in the Schedule of Benefits.
- As described under Dental Treatment in the Policy.

This exclusion does not apply to benefits specifically provided in Pediatric Dental Services.
5. Elective Surgery or Elective Treatment as defined in the Policy. This exclusion does not apply to cosmetic surgery necessitated by a covered Injury.
6. Flight in any kind of aircraft, except while riding as a passenger on a regularly scheduled flight of a commercial airline.
7. Foot care for the following:

- Flat foot conditions.
- Supportive devices for the foot.
- Subluxations of the foot.
- Fallen arches.
- Weak feet.
- Chronic foot strain.
- Routine foot care including the care, cutting and removal of corns, calluses, toenails, and bunions (except capsular or bone surgery).
This exclusion does not apply to preventive foot care due to conditions associated with metabolic, neurologic, or peripheral vascular disease.

8. Health spa or similar facilities. Strengthening programs.
9. Hearing examinations. Hearing aids. Other treatment for hearing defects and hearing loss. "Hearing defects" means any physical defect of the ear which does or can impair normal hearing, apart from the disease process.
This exclusion does not apply to:

- Hearing defects or hearing loss as a result of an infection or Injury.

10. Injury or Sickness for which benefits are paid under any Workers' Compensation or Occupational Disease Law or Act, or similar legislation.
11. Injury sustained while:

- Participating in any intercollegiate or professional sport, contest or competition.
- Traveling to or from such sport, contest or competition as a participant.
- Participating in any practice or conditioning program for such sport, contest or competition.

12. Investigational services.
13. Lipectomy.
14. Benefits which duplicate any benefits provided by the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Financial Responsibility Law.
15. Participation in a riot or civil disorder. Commission of or attempt to commit a felony.
16. Prescription Drugs, services or supplies as follows:

- Therapeutic devices or appliances, including: hypodermic needles, syringes, support garments and other nonmedical substances, regardless of intended use, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
- Immunization agents, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
- Drugs labeled, "Caution - limited by federal law to investigational use" or experimental drugs.
- Products used for cosmetic purposes.
- Drugs used to treat or cure baldness. Anabolic steroids used for body building.
- Anorectics - drugs used for the purpose of weight control.
- Fertility agents or sexual enhancement drugs.
- Growth hormones.
- Refills in excess of the number specified or dispensed after one (1) year of date of the prescription.

17. Reproductive services for the following:

- Procreative counseling.
- Genetic counseling and genetic testing, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
- Cryopreservation of reproductive materials. Storage of reproductive materials.
- Infertility treatment (male or female), including any services or supplies rendered for the purpose or with the intent of inducing conception, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
- Premarital examinations.
- Impotence, organic or otherwise.
- Female sterilization procedures, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
- Vasectomy.
- Reversal of sterilization procedures.

18. Research or examinations relating to research studies, or any treatment for which the patient or the patient's representative must sign an informed consent document identifying the treatment in which the patient is to participate as a research study or clinical research study, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
19. Routine eye examinations. Eye refractions. Eyeglasses. Contact lenses. Prescriptions or fitting of eyeglasses or contact lenses. Vision correction surgery. Treatment for visual defects and problems.
This exclusion does not apply as follows:

- When due to a covered Injury or disease process.
- For scleral lenses for keratoconus, treatment to retain moisture for lack of normal tearing, and an initial pair of eyeglasses for aphakia.
- To benefits specifically provided in Pediatric Vision Services.

20. Routine Newborn Infant Care and well-baby nursery and related Physician charge, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
21. Preventive care services which are not specifically provided in the Policy, including:

- Routine physical examinations and routine testing.
- Preventive testing or treatment.
- Screening exams or testing in the absence of Injury or Sickness.

22. Services provided normally without charge by the Health Service of the Policyholder.
23. Skydiving.
24. Speech therapy, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
25. Supplies, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
26. Surgical breast reduction, breast augmentation, breast implants or breast prosthetic devices, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
27. Treatment in a Government hospital, unless there is a legal obligation for the Insured Person to pay for such treatment.
28. War or any act of war, declared or undeclared; or while in the armed forces of any country (a pro-rata premium will be refunded upon request for such period not covered).
29. Weight management. Weight reduction. Nutrition programs. Treatment for obesity. Surgery for removal of excess skin or fat. This exclusion does not apply to benefits specifically provided in the Policy.

## UnitedHealthcare Global: Global Emergency Services

If you are a student insured with this insurance plan, you and your insured spouse, Domestic Partner and insured minor child(ren) are eligible for UnitedHealthcare Global Emergency Services. The requirements to receive these services are as follows:

International Students, insured spouse, Domestic Partner and insured minor child(ren): you are eligible to receive UnitedHealthcare Global services worldwide, except in your home country.

Domestic Students, insured spouse, Domestic Partner and insured minor child(ren): you are eligible for UnitedHealthcare Global services when 100 miles or more away from your campus address or 100 miles or more away from your permanent home address or while participating in a Study Abroad program.

The Assistance and Evacuation Benefits and related services are not meant to be used in lieu of or replace local emergency services such as an ambulance requested through emergency 911 telephone assistance. HealthiestYou physicians are an independent network of doctors who advise, diagnose, and prescribe at their own discretion. HealthiestYou physicians provide cross coverage and operate subject to state regulations. Physicians in the independent network do not prescribe DEA controlled substances, non-therapeutic drugs and certain other drugs which may be harmful because of their potential for abuse. HealthiestYou does not guarantee that a prescription will be written. Services may vary by state.
*Available to Insured students and their covered Dependents; age restrictions may apply. If you call prior to the effective date of your coverage under the insurance plan, you will be charged a service fee before being connected to a boardcertified physician.

## HealthiestYou: Virtual Counselor Access

Starting on the effective date of your coverage under the student insurance plan, you have access to mental health providers through a national virtual counseling service.* Psychiatrists, psychologists and licensed therapists are available to you through a variety of communication methods, including phone and video.

When you sign up, you'll complete a questionnaire, choose your provider and select a date and time for your appointment. Appointments are available 7 days a week. Visits are secure, discreet and confidential, and you have ongoing support with the same provider.

As an insured with Student Resources, there is no consultation fee for this service. Every communication with a provider is covered $100 \%$ during your policy period.
